PBL Focus – Weeks 1 & 2: We Are Safe – Walk Carefully Around the School

At The Summit State School, we explicitly teach and reinforce positive behaviour expectations as part of our PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) approach.

For the first two weeks of Term 3, our focus has been on: We are Safe: Walk carefully around the school.

What this looks like at school:

Students have been learning and practising how to:

- Walk on all concrete areas,
- Walk safely inside classrooms and buildings,
- Move carefully and respectfully in hallways and shared spaces, and
- Be aware of others around them when moving around the school.

Staff are consistently reinforcing these behaviours with positive feedback and reminders. Students are also being recognised with Summit Stars and praise when demonstrating safe walking throughout the day.

Helpful hints for home:

Families can support this focus by:

- Talking with your child about why walking in certain places (like near roads, shops, or at school) keeps everyone safe.
- Practising walking safely together in different settings (e.g., shopping centres, footpaths, car parks).
- Praising your child when you notice them walking calmly and safely and reminding them gently when they forget.

Reinforcing these behaviours at home helps build consistency for our learners and supports a safe and respectful environment at school.

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PBL Focus – Weeks 3: We Are Responsible – Put Rubbish in the Right Bin

At The Summit State School, we are building a culture of responsibility by teaching students how to care for their environment.

In week 3 this term, our behaviour focus is:

We are Responsible: Put rubbish in the right bin.

What this looks like at school

Students are learning how to:

Place general waste in the regular bin,

·Use yellow recycling bins correctly for paper, cardboard, and recyclables,

•Put food scraps into our compost bins or worm farm, and

·Place eligible containers, like poppers and water bottles in our Containers for Change bin.

These practices help reduce waste, care for our environment, and support sustainability initiatives already happening in our school garden and kitchen programs.

Helpful hints for home:

Families can support this focus by:

•Talking about what goes in each bin at home (you might even create your own waste-sorting system together),

Encouraging children to rinse and recycle bottles and containers properly,

·Collecting Containers for Change items for return or bringing them into school, and

Starting a small compost bin or worm farm for food scraps if you have the space.

By practising these habits at school and home, our students are learning lifelong skills about caring for the planet and taking responsibility for their actions. Every small step helps!
