## **This funding will be used to**

- Ensure 100% of students achieve the National Minimum Standards in Literacy and Numeracy.
- Ensure 100% of Prep students are reading a Progress for Meaning ( PM ) Level 6, by the end of 2022.
- Increase the percentage of Year 5 students receiving an A in English from 16% to 50% ( Year 4, 2021 ).
- Increase the percentage of Year 3 students receiving an A in English from 0% to 20% ( Year 2, 2021 ).
- Ensure 50% of Year 5 students achieve in the Upper two bands for Spelling in NAPLAN.

## **Our initiatives include**

- Continue to implement and refine a whole school reading and spelling program.
- Triangulate all students' data ( A-E, NAPLAN, Spelling and reading diagnostic testing ) to support and extend students.
- Use John Hattie's 'Visible Learning – Feedback' as a book study for teachers.

## **Our school will improve student outcomes by**

- Teacher release time for moderation, coaching, planning and feedback days - \$9000
- Purchase additional Teacher Aide time - \$10950
