Each school review generates a number of key improvement strategies to inform continuous improvement in all state schools. The next steps are...

- ➡ Strengthen teacher understanding of the Australian Curriculum and unit planning processes to develop locally relevant and engaging curriculum units for students.
- ➡ Facilitate professional development and conversations with staff members to build shared understanding and consistent expectations of the management of student behaviour.
- ➡ Implement the agreed whole-school observation and feedback process for teachers and teacher aides, that is school-specific and in line with school priorities.
- ➡ Support staff to collaboratively engage in inquiry cycles to build shared ownership of the strategic direction of the school.
